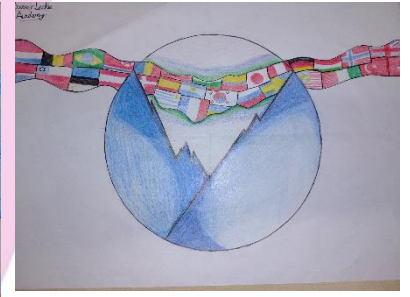

Stephen Lawrence

September 1974 - April 1993



Who was he?  Stephen Lawrence was an 18 year old Black British teenager from Plumstead in South East London who was studying for his A-levels in dreams of becoming an architect. However on 22nd April 1993, he was brutally murdered in a racially motivated attack that was completely unprovoked whilst waiting for a bus back from his uncle's house in West Ham, Eltham.

Why was he significant? Nearly 30 years later, this racist hate crime is still deemed atrocious and reveals the institutional racism of London's Metropolitan Police. Despite these existing three witnesses and five prime suspects, no arrests were made until two weeks after the murder. More disturbingly, a suspect turned themselves in however all charges were dropped and they were allowed to walk free based on 'insufficient evidence' highlighting the racism and callousness of the police. Stephen's death also sparked new civil rights movements. To clarify, protests were held in demand of the reopening of the case in which also Nelson Mandela visited the family and physically stated 'white lives were cheap'. Thanks to campaigning, in 1999 a report was published by a public inquiry judge Sir William Macpherson concluding the institutional racism.


What did he achieve? The report soon led to reforms with the police and justice system; and following 70 recommendations for the police suggested within the document, 67 were implemented with two years in the Criminal Justice Act of 2003 for instance, creating a legal obligation for police to protect good relations between ethnic communities and victims of racial violence. These were some of the first laws in Britain that truly made racism a crime that was punished by law. Stephen's story created a big cultural change and socially and ethically aware murderers of the attitudes the minority groups of us face. Moreover, to celebrate the achievement black minorities have gained, Stephen Lawrence day founded by Business Billion Laureate is celebrated. Gary Dobson and David Norris (the murderers) were finally sentenced.

Presenting Nana Asma'u



Who was she? Nana Asma'u was a prominent Nigerian scholar, poet, and educational leader. She was born in 1793 in Sokoto, Nigeria, and played a significant role in the Sokoto Caliphate.

Why was she significant? Nana Asma'u was a pioneer in education and social reform for women in West Africa. She established a school for girls and was a prolific author and poet. Her work focused on the empowerment of women and the promotion of Islamic education.

What did she achieve? Nana Asma'u's contributions to education and social reform were groundbreaking. She inspired generations of women and played a key role in the development of the Sokoto Caliphate.


Key Facts:

- She was born in 1793, in Sokoto, Caliphate
- and died in 1864, Sokoto, Caliphate
- She had died at the age of 71 leaving her child Abd al-Qadir.
- She was a respected public figure of significant authority. She was active in politics, education and social reform; she was a prolific author, popular leader, and renowned scholar and intellectual.
- Asma'u bint Umar Usman dan Fodio (1793-1864) was an Islamic scholar, poet, and educational leader in what is now Northern Nigeria. Nana Asma'u asked her nursing to help the women in her quest to break the superstitious practice of Islam, convert non-believers to Islam, and help the young women of the community of Sokoto to receive the same education as their brothers.

Presenting Mary Seacole



Who was she? Mary Seacole was a British-Jamaican nurse, healer, and businesswoman. She was born in 1805 in Kingston, Jamaica, and played a significant role in the Crimean War.

Why was she significant? Mary Seacole was a pioneer in nursing and healthcare for people of color. She established a nursing home in London and played a key role in the Crimean War, where she provided medical care to British soldiers.

What did she achieve? Mary Seacole's contributions to nursing and healthcare were groundbreaking. She inspired generations of nurses and played a key role in the development of the nursing profession.

Key Facts:

- Mary Seacole was a British-Jamaican nurse, healer and businesswoman who set up the "British Hotel" behind the lines during the Crimean War.
- She was born on 23rd November 1805, in Kingston Jamaica. She died on 16th May 1882, in Paddington London.
- Her leadership and courage put her name on the map for nursing in the world. And as a woman who composed the first professional nursing school in her country, Seacole's influence was more powerful and in a variety of settings.
- Mary travelled to England and approached the British War Office, asking to be sent as an army nurse to Crimea where she had heard there were poor medical facilities for wounded soldiers.

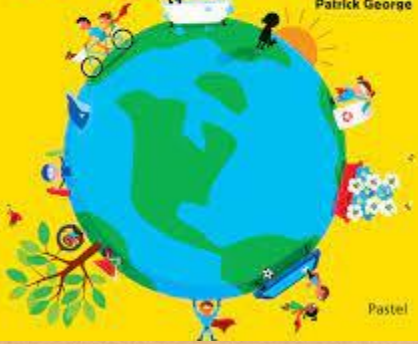

Cultural - Thanksgiving Day is a national holiday in the United States, and this year occurs on Thursday, November 25. It is predominately a North American holiday, but with over 139,000 US citizens in the UK it will also be celebrated by some here in the UK! In 1621 a group of Europeans, who became known as the 'Pilgrims', invited the local Native Americans to join them in a feast.

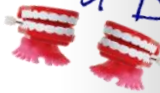
