I know our Year 11 and 13 students (and earlyentry GCSE students in Year 10!) will have spent the weekend revising and preparing for their upcoming exams. We wish them all the very best. ## Key Highlights from Last Week....

There was plenty going on in the academy last week including our assemblies to mark National Science Week, which were built around the theme of 'time'. The assemblies were both enthusiastically delivered and informative, encouraging our students to become excited about the wider world and impact of science. Linked to this, we are also very excited to be running a special project where a Joseph Leckie time capsule is being prepared and then buried!

Last week saw the end of our GCSE language speaking exams. The exams started with French and then last week we moved on to other languages where students are taking a GCSE qualification. This included Polish, Gujarati, Urdu, Spanish, Italian, German, Arabic and Mandarin! Amazing! The exams involved a great deal of organisation and preparation from the staff and students but will hopefully lead to some incredibly valuable language qualifications being achieved by our students.

As I'm sure you're aware, 2024 is an Olympic Year and we are planning on marking this in style. As part of our site development, we really want to improve the quality of our sporting facilities and hopefully the Olympic Games will provide a springboard for launching this project. Among a range of sporting events and activities planned, we have our annual Sports Day coming up in July. Students will receive more information about this very soon.

Last week we received some excellent feedback from the exam board regarding the quality of work produced by students following our Childcare qualification in Year 13. The report was incredibly complimentary of the standard of the work produced by our students and the outcomes of this work. Well done to everyone involved.

A group of Year 10 and 12 students visited the Birmingham City University (BCU) Product and Furniture Design department last week. Here, they took part in practical activities, using the university's impressive facilities and resources. They also learned about higher education opportunities and career prospects within this sector. Our students clearly got lots out of this visit along with building collaborative links with BCU for the future. The lecturer from BCU who hosted the visited wrote to us afterwards and said:

I am sure you will agree this is fantastic feedback.


## **Key Reminders and Academy Expectations...**

This week's reminders focus on our expectations of students on the playground and when they are outside the classroom. As the weather gets warmer, I want to reinforce the expectation that drinks must not be thrown. A very small minority of students persist in engaging in throwing water (etc.) at other students and this will not be tolerated under any circumstances. The minimum consequence for throwing water will be that the student involved will not be allowed to go out on the playground at lunchtime for a set period of time and will receive an after school detention.

The other key issue we face is litter. You may recall we had to temporarily stop selling cartons of drink at lunchtimes because so many of the empty cartons were dropped in the playground, causing the amount of litter to increase significantly. After a short ban, we reintroduced the cartons. I am sorry to inform you that the litter has since increased again. I am therefore making it clear to students that the levels of litter are being monitored this week and if there is no improvement, the only drinks available to students at lunchtimes will be water.

I really value your support with both the water throwing and the litter dropping as they are two large issues we face as an academy at this time of year. Thankfully it is only a small minority of students who choose to behave in this way however it is impacting on all of us and must stop immediately. As the expectations below set out, we want our students to be 'sensible and safe' when they are on the playground.

The outdoor expectations are set out below:





Remain in your allocated area during break and lunchtime.



Be sensible and safe; do not run across the yard.




All food must be eaten in the dining hall or canopy and not on the yard.

Use the sports equipment appropriately; no vandalism.
