Tutorial Support

At the beginning of the academic year, students will be set targets according to their overall performance at GCSE level. These targets are set to provide a benchmark against which students are monitored over two years. In order to meet and exceed targets, students are supported by a dedicated Sixth Form Tutor, who will monitor progress and assist with university applications. Individual student data is carefully tracked and monitored in order to ensure that appropriate interventions are provided to support positive student outcomes.

Available Courses

Joseph Leckie Academy Sixth Form offers a comprehensive suite of Level Three A level and vocational qualifications to appeal to all students of all abilities.

An overview of our comprehensive range of courses is provided here. For further information, the course booklet (enclosed) provides full details of specific course content and methods of assessment.

A levels offer an academic and traditional route to university with a final examination, whilst vocational subjects offer a modern equivalent for students who may prefer coursework based or on-going formative assessment.

A Level Choices

A levels offer a traditional and academic route to higher education. They are widely recognised as the accepted standard for university entry and are based on the A*- E model of assessment. Examinations are taken, in most cases, only at the end of two years study. This makes A levels an attractive proposition for students who have achieved 5 grades 4-9 including English and maths and who fare well in final examinations. We offer a large range of A level courses across varied curriculum.

Students opting for A level courses will normally choose three subjects (four by agreement), following all courses through to the end of the two-year programme of study.

UCAS A level points range from 56 (A*) to 16 (E). We do not offer AS examinations, except in a select subject areas.

Vocational Choices

Modern vocational subjects are equivalent to A levels in terms of UCAS points. Vocational subjects offer some examination content, but with an increased focus on coursework. Students who prefer an ongoing method of assessment, as opposed to examinations at the end of two years, may prefer the study style of vocational qualifications.

Students opting for vocational qualifications follow a two year programme in two specific areas, opting for one subject at single level (1 A level equivalent) and a second subject at double level (2 A level equivalent); meaning that they achieve UCAS points equivalent to three A levels at the end of two years study. Universities are increasingly keen to make offers to students who have studied at least one subject "in greater depth." Our vocational offer means that students are able to apply to Russell Group universities.

Students opting for BTEC courses may choose either the Extended Certificate (Single Award) or Diploma (Double Award). Below are Sixth Form vocational subjects we offer and their values:

All students who fail to meet the minimum standard of a Grade 4 (C) in English and / or mathematics will be timetabled additional lessons in order to improve their GCSE grade in these subjects in order to achieve a "good" pass.

Applying to Sixth Form

All Year 11 students attending Joseph Leckie Academy will have the opportunity to apply to the Sixth Form.

Entry is based upon performance in GCSE examinations, coupled with a positive approach to studies, excellent attendance, punctuality and behaviour. Students from other establishments are also welcome to apply.

Timetable for Applications

Deadline for application forms to Sixth Form: 20th January 2023 Admission interviews commence: 25th January 2023 External interviews commence: 6th March 2023

The Application Process

Students wishing to apply to the Sixth Form will need to complete an application form and provide evidence of good attendance and punctuality, a positive behaviour record and a desire to study. External students must bring evidence of this to the interview.

The student will then be invited for an career based interview with the Head of Sixth Form to establish potential grades and the most appropriate programme of study to meet their aspirations following compulsory education. Information provided by the student along with estimated grades will be used to form the basis of a provisional offer.

Students predicted extremely good GCSE grades will be given the opportunity to study four subjects. Most universities require three "good" A levels or vocational qualifications only. An Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is offered to students who wish to complete further academic study in addition to their standard offer.



The following guidelines offer an outline of potential offers which may be made to students based upon their GCSE / Level Two results. There are exceptions and we are happy to tailor specific programmes for students who wish to combine A level study with vocational subjects.

A Level Pathway

Minimum of 5 4+ grades at GCSE (or equivalent) with English and Maths Grade 6 or equivalent preferred in chosen subject. Merit in vocational subjects preferred.

Vocational Pathway

Minimum of 5 4+ grades at GCSE or equivalent. Ment in vocational subjects preferred.

Level 2 Courses

Minimum of 5.2+ grades at GCSE or equivalent

By Car


We are half a mile from Walsall Football Club's ground, Banks's Stadium, which is sign posted off the Broadway.
